VICKI ALLEN REID (Choreographer) is third generation "Theatre." Her great aunt was Cora Youngblood Corson—a headliner on The Orpheum Circuit. Ms. Reid began her professional career in The Corps de Ballet at Starlight Theatre in the 1960's, then moved to New York to appear in nightclubs with such acts as "Hines, Hines and Dad." She has performed as a principal dancer with the leading opera companies of this country and has several network television specials to her credit, sharing the screen with such luminaries as Bob Hope and Ann-Margaret. Returning to Kansas City to raise a family, she currently teaches ballet at The American Dance Center and advanced tap at The Full Circle Company where she is a founding member and artistic force.
