

director's note

On the surface "A Chorus Line" is a story about dancers going through an audition for a Broadway musical. Zach, the director, requires that those auditioning for his show "put it on the line" and share their inner-most feelings with him in order to get what they want; a job in this show. MARK SWEZEY, Director

Mark is originally form New York. He attended St. John's University and the University of Kansas. After school he studied acting and directing at the famed Cafe La Mama in New York City. Mark has directed and acted in over 200 productions including community, professional, and academic theatre. In 1988 he received a Best of Theatre Award for his direction of Theatre in the Park's production of Cabaret. His production of A CHORUS LINE won Best Community Theatre Production in 1987. He also received a Best Director Award for Theatre League's production of NUNSENSE, and a Buddy Award for directing OCTA's production of NUNSENSE. For his production of INTO THE WOODS last season, he was awarded a Standing Ovation Award as Best Director of a Musical. He has also directed THE MYSTERY OF EDWIN DROOD, THE KING AND I. JESUS CHRIST SUPERSTAR, GREASE, BIG RIVER, ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST, THE ELEPHANT MAN, AMADEUS, THE TEMPEST, A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM, ANNIE GET YOUR GUN, WEST SIDE STORY, and GODSPELL. Mark is the Director of Theatre at Shawnee Mission South High School, and was awarded Teacher of Merit from the Association of Kansas Theatres.

MOLLY JESSUP CUTLER, Vocal Director, Conductor

Molly has been a music director in the Kansas City area for the past twenty years.
